


Chasing Unicorns: A Quest for Clarity in Drug-Related Crime

Background

- drug-related crime = theoretical concept indicating the link between drug use and crime
- actual extent and structure is rather unclear
- lack of data on this potential drug supply indicator → project to propose a new way of collecting data on this phenomenon
- trying to avoid the displayed scenario →



Preparation

- novel methodology
- new comprehensive categorisation
- police as a key institution
 - data collection by police officers at the beginning of the criminal proceedings
- participatory approach
 - involvement and interest of the police
- provide a tool for routine and standardised data collection
 - guidelines
- the end of the project does not mean the end of the effort. The hardest part starts here


Data collection

- take the time to negotiate
- do not lose control of the process
- speak their language
- explain, explain and....explain
- motivate data collectors
- convince higher officers and decision makers of the benefits
- minimise the administrative burden
- make data collection as easy as possible
- nationwide data collection was launched in 2024

Interpretation

- ensure access to data
- maintain good relations with police statistics
- interpret the data in the appropriate context
- emphasise the limits and nature of the data
- triangulate with other data sources
- generate interest in data on high profile individuals and different stakeholders
- try to avoid misuse and misinterpretation
- the first year's data will be available soon
